WHAT REALLY DEFINES AN "EXCELLENT" SCHOOL?

There have been some articles in the newspapers recently which have been focusing on excellent or the top schools in the country. A few weeks ago, Bergvliet was fortunate to be mentioned as one of the 15 schools of excellence in the Western Cape in the *Weekend Argus*. We all rejoiced. Then, the very next day, we were not mentioned in the top 100 schools in the country in the *Sunday Times*. We all spurned lists and doubted the criteria used for selection. It was funny to observe our fickle attitudes, but it did raise the question: Who or what decides what an excellent school is?

I would like to suggest that we should ask our own question: Are we an excellent school? I would also like to suggest that excellence might not be a comparative thing. In other words, we do not measure excellence in terms of being better or worse than another school. We measure excellence according to what is happening right here in our school. Are we making the most of what we have with what we have?

As I look around I see many signs of excellence. The recent musical that the school put on is one example. A look at the list from the Matric Awards Ceremony we have just celebrated, shows how many of our Matrics have been excelling in their various spheres, from academic to sport to service for the community and the school. As educators we have been visiting each other's classes to evaluate our performance in the classroom. I have been inspired and proud of what happens in some of our classes. This is yet another sign of excellence. During the valedictory I looked at the faces of the matrics who were about to leave us. There were faces of young, strong, positive, proud, motivated young people staring back at me. I remembered many of these young people as they were when they first came to Bergvliet High School. Some have always been bright stars, but others have had to work hard. We have had our battles with some, but they too have set their goal to matriculate and are in the process of doing so.
